Upcoming Events—

- Todd Welsh reported that 88 people were signed up for the August 20 Hot Fun in the Summertime Pool Party, featuring the band Vuja De. He said seven residents were waitlisted. Todd also explained that the website was very efficient and recommended using it for future reservations. A pool party reminder will be sent out this week.
