

Social Committee General Meeting – January 12, 2026

Mary P. called the meeting to order at 7:06 p.m. Mary welcomed two (2) new members to the Social Committee; Joan Bressi and Susan Puleo.

Approval of minutes- Barbara M. made a motion to approve the January 12, 2026 minutes. Susan seconded the motion and the minutes were approved.

Treasurer's Report— Cassie D. said the November 30, 2025 account balance was \$8850.85 less the Good Neighbor fund of \$710.50 for a net balance of \$8140.35. The December 31, 2025 account balance was \$8362.77 less the Good Neighbor fund of \$715.50 for a net balance of \$7647.27.

Activity Reports—

- November 13 – Veteran's Day Ceremony
 - It was beneficial to have in the Sloan Clubhouse parking lot as there was more room for seating.
 - The introductions from the putting green to honor the veterans was a good idea.
- December 7 – Holiday Party
 - The feedback has been favorable; the Committee will be distributing a short survey for residents to make additional suggestions.
 - A third entrée of red meat was included this year per response from last year's survey
 - The DJ created a party atmosphere and engaged residents to dance.
 - The Committee is working to organize the event for this year. (2026)
- December 15-31- Holiday Decorating Contest
 - Winners will be announced in the February RAP Newsletter
 - A review is being done to determine the total # of votes (households) that voted.
- December 14- RAP Recorder Ensemble Holiday Concert
 - The attendance was limited due to the snow that accumulated earlier in the day.
 - Musicians traveling from Philadelphia were unable to participate due to travel conditions.
- December 19- Cookie Exchange
 - Responses from participants indicated it was a nice evening.
- December 31 – New Year's Eve Party – Regency Hills
 - Twenty-four (24) residents attended; this was lower than last year.
 - Enid reported that more attendees stayed until midnight than in prior years.
 - Food consisted of appetizers and desserts.
 - There was a suggestion to potentially change the event to an earlier time. It may allow more residents to attend.
- January 9 – Coffee at the Clubhouse
 - Thirty (30) residents were in attendance; including one new household.

 - Mary stated that the July 4th picnic is being rescheduled to July 2nd as this is the official date of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. This would also give residents an opportunity to participate in other activities outside of RAP.
